



Immigration to Nova Scotia

Federal and provincial governments share jurisdiction

Provincial government (Nova Scotia)

nominates and endorses candidates who contribute to the labour market and economy in the province

Federal government (Canada)

Final entry into Canada

Visas (work, study, etc.)

Immigrate to Canada (PR)

No application fees to the Nova Scotia Nominee Program (NSNP) or Atlantic Immigration Program (AIP), but there are fees for other parts of the process

Nova Scotia Nominee Program: Two Step Process

Nomination Application (Provincial Jurisdiction)



PR Application (Federal Jurisdiction)

Apply to Nova Scotia Labour, Skills and Immigration (LSI)

Led by Candidate

Eligibility depends on stream requirements

Submit complete application with employer documents

If approved, candidate gets a nomination certificate





Work Permit Approval (*Optional*)

Permanent Residence Approval

Apply to Immigration Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC)

Led by Candidate

Meet federal requirements such as: medical, security and criminality admissibility





Atlantic Immigration Program (AIP)

TEER 0 job offers

TEER 1 job offers

TEER 2 job offers

TEER 4 job offers

Addresses regional labour market needs

Process:

Employer leads the application process

Candidate gets a job offer from designated AIP employer

Job offer is endorsed by province through the employer

Candidate eligibility requirements

Innovative approaches:

Regional/federal agreement

Employer plays a greater role

Supports newcomer settlement

PR Application (Federal Jurisdiction)

Led by Employer

Employer must meet criteria
Connection to Settlement
Service Provider
Employer starts training
Online designation application
Employer gets designated under
the AIP

Led by Employer

Job offer must meet criteria

Employer and candidate obtain settlement plan

Employer completes all required training

Online endorsement application

If approved, candidate receives endorsement certificate





Work Permit Approval (Optional) Permanent Residence Approval

Led by Candidate

Candidate applies for permanent residence with endorsement certificate


